Space. This space is normally used to communicate with the church family what has happened in the past month, or what is coming up in Youth and Family Ministry. A calendar of sorts, which some may skim and decide that nothing applies; and others



may use to plan how to get to the fun or important events, or how to help. Instead, this month, I want to share with you something much more important. Our church is changing. It's growing.

I sense the pregnant fullness of something in the belly. Next will come the uncomfortable feeling of impending insecurities and then the groans and growls of labor... but if we endure and work through, we will receive the gift of new life. That's what this is all about, right? This church business we're doing each week, each Sunday, and sometimes every day in between the Sundays. The full, pregnant possibility of new life for ourselves, new life for others, and new life inside the walls of our beloved buildings is what we strive for as Christian believers. It's the promise of a fresh, new start today, and an eternal life that motivates us to stretch our bodies, our minds, and our wills to birth a new life.

It's following Jesus that takes us out of our church and into the world; the cold, dark, hurtful, awful world. A world that has fallen short and often rejects us as we walk out of our precious pews into every Sunday. We are called, so we go. We go and we extend our hands to those who look like they need Jesus. We feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the sick, dying and imprisoned and we give drink to the thirsty. Because Jesus told us that this is the way to be like Him. We do it for the least. Then we come in on Sunday morning to be fed and filled and fortified so that we can go back out and do it all again.

But what happens when we come in on Sunday, and we don't feel fed, filled or fortified? What happens when our attention is on noisy kids and diapers that need changed; on fights over crayons and etch-a-sketches or who got the last of those delicious cookies? What happens when we can't pay attention to the message because someone's hair is on fire or there are people getting up to use the restroom or we just can't focus because of the disagreement we had with our spouse over coffee this morning? What if our hearts are broken because we are missing our beloved spouse? Are we still pregnant with possibility and potential when we aren't "feeling" the love from the church? Of course. Are we joyful about it? Probably not.

I've met all kinds of pregnant women over my life. I've even been one. I have seen women who, like me, enjoy every second of the pregnancy, and I've spent time with women who absolutely detest being pregnant and try to rush through their 40-week incubation period like mad hatters beyond the looking glass. I have been on both sides of that pregnant feeling in many churches. I've watched as beautiful ideas are spat on and slapped away, much like Christ on the road to Golgotha, and I've seen people hissing and booing from the side of the road. I have also witnessed people leave the comfort of their hiding place to come to an event in the church, to meet Jesus. I've heard the stories of those who minister to others because their hearts are moved.

I have been blessed many times in the past month, to see how very pregnant our churches are; and to see the belly widening with each person who steps in to be a part of the growth. I see people from all different ages, with all different reasons coming together to stretch and dilate and contract and breathe. And yet, while there are some coming, there are others who have reservations. They doubt that they can do anything, and to them, I can only say this: there is no end to our life bearing years until Jesus says so. If you are like Sarah and saying, "Will God give Abraham a son in his old age?" remember that God's answer was a resounding, "Yes!" in a wrinkled little boy named Isaac. We are never too old to bring forth new life in the church. If you are wondering if you are too young, well, then I must tell you that Mary was probably around 13 years old when she became pregnant with Jesus. Mary was not married, had never been with a man, but was betrothed or engaged to Joseph; Jewish history and culture says that young women were often married as they entered their teenage years. So if she hadn't been married yet, she was likely just entering her teens. I say then no! You are not too young to bring forth new life. You are the perfect age! As long as God is your birth coach, you are going to be just fine. When the pain gets too much to bear, cry out to Jesus. Who better to have in your delivery room than THE deliverer? Who better to stand with you through the excruciating pain than the one who endured hell and overcame death? What then, are we pregnant with? What is this new life? Only God really knows, but I suspect that it is new ministry. New direction, new purpose, a renewed sense of belonging to the Lord, and service through gratitude. I sense that a right and re-centered focus on God would bring us to a kinder, more intentional way of loving each other, as Jesus commanded us. Our neighbor as ourselves. Not just saying "good morning", but actually looking our neighbors in the eye and seeing what God wants us to see. Perhaps that is what is in the womb of our pregnant churches. Won't you pray with me that whatever God is delivering will be set free and released for His kingdom purposes, that this new life will be welcomed, yes, and even expected? That all God's people will say, "Amen", yes, "So be it Lord"! I can almost hear the rush of the waiting room now. People are coming to see our new life!
