It took a while to get all the components completed, but we are now benefitting from all 6 components of the \$32,319 grant received through the Washington County Riverboat Foundation: 1) Updated electricity service in the North Building; 2) New furnace and air conditioning in the church office at the North Church; 3) New air conditioning in the South Church; 4) Six new Wi-Fi capable thermostats

between the two churches; 5) Repainted roof trip at the North Church, and 6) New carpet in the South Church sanctuary. Through the Building Fund, we did contribute 20 percent of the total cost of these updates from our own treasury. It would have taken us much longer to have compiled this much money for the total project on our own. Thank you to those compiling information for the grant and overseeing the project.

SUMMER 2018 PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS



The June meeting was abbreviated because of a pending storm; no meeting in July because of summer vacations. This information is a summary of the August meeting. Youth Group: As of June 15, Sam Kruse resigned from his Youth Group Leader position with ACC/UCC and accepted employment

with City Point as their music leader. The Council recommended to SPPRC that Kristin Schell be employed as a Youth Group Leader working with Nick Yoder. Nick shared that the credit earned for "Coins for Camping" will be used next summer. The Mission Trip to Des Moines was a great learning experience for all. Youth Group will begin on September 30 with a kick-off event. Christian Education: About 25 youth and 20 volunteers were involved with VBS. Kids' Club Kickoff will be Wednesday, September 12 at 6 PM at Marr Park. Property – Parsonage: Property manager Tim Elliott has a new family living in the parsonage. Updates completed between renters included: new vinyl flooring in the entry, bath and kitchen; new carpet in the dining room, living room and study; carpet going up the stairs and on the 2nd floor was professionally cleaned. Professional cleaners cleaned the entire house. Fellowship Hall: Carpet was cleaned; broken water heater in kitchen replaced; Memorial Monies were used to replace kitchen sink faucets. Garage/Old Office: Still plans to tear it down. We will save \$150/year in insurance costs once removed. The Renovation and Update Project is now complete thanks to monies from the Washington County Riverboat Foundation. South Church: New security lights installed. North Church: Drinking fountain at the bottom of the stairs was removed because of a leaking issue that was not cost effective to repair. Mission – In June, they served 16 families through the food pantry representing 43 persons. In July, 11 families were served representing a total of 36 persons. Leftover food from the pantry was taken to the garden at the school. Mission Committee would like to sponsor the "Building Bridges" program at our church in 2019. The Mission Committee also shared a draft of a proposal outlining their Mission and "Guidelines for Assistance". Regarding Financial Needs, the guidelines specify a dollar amount to help a family within one year with items such as utilities, rent, repairs, medication, diapers, etc. Monies would be paid to the vendor – not the family. Also, a gas allowance is addressed stating up to \$25 would be paid to Stewarts or the Four Corners – no cash will be handed to an individual. Food Pantry: the pantry will continue to be open once a month and in the case of emergencies. At least 2 adults from the church must be present when assisting emergency food needs unless the person making the request is familiar to the committee members. Resources: Persons requesting assistance will also be made aware of all services available in Washington County. Parish Council commended the Mission Committee for developing the guidelines and gives full support. Old Business: A subcommittee of Wayne, Wendell, and Jason will develop a plan for replacing tables, chairs, and storage units/carts for the North and South churches. New Business: Permission was granted to baptize the Davis Family on Sept. 16 at Marr Park following worship. Permission was also granted to marry Erin Mills and Kyle Entsminger on August 24, 2019. The next regular meeting will be Monday, September 10.
