At the January 14 Parish Council meeting, guest Stan Tate of the Presbytery explained they wish to be closer to congregations and more 'user friendly'. His team is offering two services at no charge: 1) Assistance starting Life Groups/Small Groups and 2) Visioning. His specialty is Life Groups.



<u>Christian Education</u>: The Youth Christmas Program had great participation from youth in community. Kids' Club resumes January 16. Jan and Karen will work on background checks. <u>Membership/Nurture</u>: Funeral dinners were organized for Mabel Wood - November 4; Wilma Chalupa – November 5; Kerm Jenkins - November 15; and Shirley Steele – January 12. A gift certificate was presented to the Collier Family upon death of Theresa - Tina's sister. <u>Worship</u> – Thanks to all helping with Advent. Working now on pulpit supply for 2019. Modifications are being made in the recipient list for "Upper Room." <u>Property</u> – Marshall Crossett cleaned the gutters and worked to repair a leak at the South Church. While the ground is frozen, they may attempt to tear down the old office building. All the new tables and chairs have been delivered and the old transferred to the north building. Thanks to Neil and Pastor Jason for replacing the light bulb in the sanctuary. AND, thanks to Clifton for getting a salt supply to the north building. <u>Mission</u> – In

November, the Mission Committee food pantry served 15 families for a total of 48 people. Everyone received either a turkey breast or a whole turkey plus all the fixings. In December, the Mission Committee served 16 families for a total of 57 people. Tim Anding collected \$220, Sacha donated \$200 and there was a \$100 donation making it possible for 8 families to receive a \$50 gift card to Fareway and 3 families received \$25. Families were invited to have their photo taken for Christmas. Not many showed up but the ones that did really liked their photos. In December the Highland Outreach program (about 20 1st grade students) was served snacks and given small gifts after sharing at Townview Village. In January, Kathi served lunch to five 5th grade students and their teacher plus residents at Town View Village. Colleen shared that Hills bank wishes to volunteer to assist us with an effort at the church as well as donate cups and napkins. Jason has placed donation containers at the 4 Corners Restaurant and gas station seeking contributions for the Mission Committee and the Ainsworth Fire Station. Old Business: The rescheduled Charge Conference was attended by 4 from Ainsworth. Materials were approved as submitted. We were approved for nonprofit status for small business bulk mail and will not pay an annual fee. **New Business**: 1) Committee liaisons are: Myron – Mission; Clifton - Property; Colleen - SPPRC; Janene - Membership/Nurture; Rachel -Education; Jan - Worship. 2) Pulpit supply dates for 2019 - January 13; May 19, 26th, June 2nd and 9th. It was agreed to grant Jason Pulpit Supply for March 17 while he serves as the designated clergy at the Emmaus walk weekend. 3) There was a request to purchase the pulpit at the North Church - Consensus -it is not for sale. 4) It was agreed to move forward with technology to enable donations on the church Facebook page but add a footnote informing donors that a percentage of their donation goes to PayPal for processing fees. A separate bank account will be used to make it easier to summarize donor giving. 5) "Life Groups" - Sherrie Hansen is interested in starting "Life Groups" small life support/Bible Study groups. There will be a series of 3 Informational meetings in February to familiarize people and model the concept. Parish Council will address requests for financial assistance to support the groups. 6) Fund Balance report is due to district office the end of February. Reports are needed from Youth Group, ACCW, ACC, and, Mission. 7) Jan will be working on statistical reports for both denominations that are due by mid-February. 8) The baptism of Oliver Carstensen was approved. Next monthly meeting: Monday, February 11.
