We will replace some flooring on the main floor that was damaged when the pipes froze as well as carpet in the master bedroom. Mission - In January the food pantry served 13 families for a total of 51 people. In February, Sherrie and Jim Hansen, Chris Sieren, and Brenda Bean covered the Food Pantry while Kathi was on vacation. They served 11 families for a total of 42 people.
