

Parish Council Highlights

An overview of reports and issues discussed at the June 8 meeting. Treasurer's Report: Colleen shared that the Payroll Protection Plan loan is inflating some of the figures; rules governing those monies are continuing to



evolve. The Council thanked her for her skills in guiding us through the process/program. Pastor and Youth Group Report: He has no mileage or vacation to report. Christian Education: No report. Membership/Nurture: Care Team continues with calls. Worship -Bibles have been delivered to high school seniors. Property: No report. Mission – The Food Pantry is having families place orders and drive by to pick it up. Food and fund drive were put on hold for now. SPPRC; Nominating: We need to find another youth/s for Parish Council as Shalyn graduated. The names of several youth were suggested. Jan will contact the nominating committee. The Council wished to express their gratitude to Shalyn for her dedication to the Council noting how engaged she had been - not just attending meetings but also actively participating. Old Business: Scholarship recipients announced; Bibles delivered. New Business: Security cameras: Jason has had time to explore the purchase of security cameras for both buildings. The Council had previously approved the purchase and consensus was that he should proceed to 'make it happen'. Parking lot worship: Jason has purchased an FM receiver so parishioners may remain in their car and hear the service over the radio. After some discussion it was decided to try holding outdoor worship on two Sunday's in June – once at each church. Congregation may remain in car or bring lawn chair and socially distance in lawn. Buildings will be open only for access to bathrooms. Worship will still be offered on Saturdays via Zoom and Facebook. Because worship at each building will have so many days in between, it was also agreed that only bathrooms, door handles, light switches, etc. would need to be sanitized – but not the entire building and its contents. **Re-entry into sanctuary for worship**: Jan volunteered to develop a proposal to share at the July meeting based upon church and CDC guidelines. Next Meeting: The next regular/Zoom meeting: Monday, July 13.
