PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

An overview of reports and issues discussed at the March meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Colleen noted the payment to Armstrong Heating for gas line repairs and paying the property taxes. Everything is on track with the budget. **Pastor Report**: Jason shared more details about the free monitoring equipment provided by Guide One Insurance Company. There are three components – a freezing temperature monitor; a water leak monitor, and an armed



intruder monitor. He has installed them at just the south building. He asked for feedback concerning serving communion on Easter Sunday. He had no mileage to report. He thanked Rachel Carstensen and Brenda Bean for being witnesses to the Axyl Havel baptism.

Jason's plan for Renewal Leave July 12 through August 21:

- 5 weeks to be spent in the Washington State area. One week in Guatemala at Bethel ministry helping with handicap accessibility.
- He will camp with his family out on the Puget sound on family beach property.
- Each week he will read a book and report to a Clearance Committee. This committee consists of 4 pastor friends who he meets with regularly and his spiritual director.

Worship: Senior Sunday will be May 2. Seven seniors to be presented Bibles: Charlie Aicher, Ellie Anderson, Isaac Black, Caedon Harbison, Jenna Sands, Gabrielle Dawley, and Areil Mills. While Pastor Jason is on Renewal Leave, Scott Johnson has agreed to serve as Pulpit Supply on July 18, 25, August 8 and 15. Parnell Davis may be filling in on August 1. Property: Myron had nothing in particular to share from the Property Committee. Membership/Nurture and Christian Education: No report. SPPRC: Work needs to begin on Second Set of Eyes report due by May 1. Jason will be contacting members of the committee. Mission: - February 2021 - The committee served 15 families (47 individuals) during February. They provided a few supplies for the monthly meal at Town View Village. The received a \$250 donation from an Ainsworth area family who wrote, "We've been fortunate this year to have our jobs and everything, so we felt this money could go to someone in need." They said to spend it or sent it where we thought it would help someone. We decided to purchase non-food items that are often requested at the food pantry such as toilet tissue, laundry soap, dish soap, shampoo, etc. March 2021 - The committee served 13 families (31 individuals) in March. Old Business: Jason is still finetuning the camera for sanctuary worship and the 'shotgun' microphone. New Business: Lawn care: Darrel (Buzz) Chalupa is willing to continue doing lawn care for us using his own equipment. He mows, trims, sprays around buildings and picks up sticks, etc. It was agreed to pay him \$50 per mowing. Masks: Following discussion, it was agreed to have Jan put a reminder in the power point and bulletin requesting worshipers to wear their mask during worship out of consideration for others. UMC Split: Jason shared information about a potential split in the United Methodist Church. The two options are Progressive and Conservative. At the moment this is just information – no action needed. Technology Booth - We are seeking additional persons to operate the technology booth during worship on Sundays. Nick Yoder is no longer available and Jason's children are doing it for us, but they are going to want some time off this summer. Following discussion, it was decided to start paying youth \$30 per worship time. (divide \$30 between the number working). Parish Council may need to fill in until we find replacements. Jan and Jason will reach out to some people. Next regular meeting: The next regular meeting will be Monday, May 10.
