WOMEN AT THE WELL UMC



Did you know the church is in prison? Women at the Well is our sister congregation, a United Methodist congregation within the walls of the women's correctional institution in Mitchellville, Iowa. The lead pastor involved in this ministry, Rev. Paul Witmer, will be with us on

Sunday, **February 20**, to share with us about the many years of weekly worship, supportive community, faith nurture groups, and aftercare we have offered to the women there. Maybe you'll find your own place in prison—in ministry with these women, our sisters in Christ.

Pastor Paul Witmer: Ordained in the United Church of Christ, Pastor Paul Witmer has served as a pastor for more than 30 years in rural and suburban settings, including a new church start in the 90s here in Iowa. He has extensive experience teaching contemplative practices, leading retreats, and working with folks in twelve-step recovery. A trained Spiritual Director, Paul also works with many in developing deep listening skills and growing on the spiritual journey. As an artist and musician, Paul is especially drawn to the arts as creative expression and experience of the Divine.

Paul has been working with Women at the Well, a prison congregation of the United Methodist Church at the Iowa women's prison in Mitchellville, Iowa since 2016. As of July 1, 2021, Paul has been appointed to serve as the lead pastor for the prison congregation. Paul is a graduate of Southwestern University (Georgetown, TX) and Eden Seminary (St. Louis, MO). He resides with his wife in Urbandale. Between them they have five grown children and three grandchildren.

Pastor's Report: Jason shared that he attended the Wesleyan Covenant Association (WCA) meeting. He also shared that he had been in quarantine twice in December. Committee Reports - Worship: Wonderful attendance for the Youth Christmas Program. Upper Room was mailed to those not picking up at worship. Thanks to Linda and her committee for the wonderful Christmas decorations in the sanctuary. Special thanks to Myron and Janet for the manger scene. Linda would like the property committee to address two issues: 1) complete painting in the Fellowship Hall and make sure Kirby is reimbursed. 2) Review parking guidelines with the parsonage tenants. We may need to update the "Handicapped Parking" signs in the north lot next to the sidewalk on the north side of the South Church. Christian Education: Thanks to all who helped and participated in the Christmas Program. No current plans for Kids' Club. Membership/Nurture: Cards sent as needed. **Property:** Jason got our name on the list for the roof bid with Merle Dene Miller of Kalona. He also worked with the committee on replacing light switches in the sanctuary. Upper lights in the sanctuary chandelier are working again. Lights are also on Wi-Fi now. Two of the three furnaces in the South Church were repaired. They had issues with the circuit board and a 'gas media' device. New parts and 3 service calls later and the furnaces are working again. When the parsonage was inspected in December, they saw the dining room flooring that the renter had replaced. He did an excellent job. He offered to provide labor to use the same type of resilient flooring to replace the dated carpet in the master bedroom and living room. Cost of materials would be about \$1400.00. The parsonage must also have a new roof as soon as possible. Mission: -Received two donations from KCII Call-a-thon for food pantries. Old Business: (Includes December items): Finance: Apportionments were paid to each denomination; Old Copier: It is cheaper to purchase the old copier than to ship it - they gave us a special rate. The old copier will be used by the Mission Committee; Charge Conference: Myron, Jason and Jan attended Charge Conference and submitted the necessary materials to the Conference; Baptism: Maggie Edwards was baptized on Sunday, November 29, 2021. New Business: Flooring in the parsonage: It was agreed to purchase new flooring for the living room and master bedroom in the parsonage as long as the tenant has in installed by May 1, 2022. Youth Group Leaders: It was agreed to employ Allan Allsup and Crystal to provide leadership and guidance for the Ainsworth CC Youth Group for an honorarium of \$200 total each month. The program will be reviewed in 6 months to see if changes are needed. The program shall have an estimated start date of February 1, 2022. Snow Removal: Randy Arthur and John Ward will clear the parking area and sidewalks this winter. Next regular meeting: The next regular meeting of the ACC Parish Council will be Thursday, February 10 rather than the 14 as that is Valentine's Day. In March, the group will resume meeting the 2nd Monday of each month. Jason closed with prayer at 8:09 PM.
