

Pastor's Report: In addition

He had his annual review on 9.15. No mileage to submit. Committee Reports: Christian Education: Kids' Club has concluded the fall session. A harvest meal was celebrated with participants, volunteers and their families. Membership/Nurture: Served funeral dinner for Mike Gesling family and sent birthday flowers to Dale Holmes. **Property:** We are first on Greg Bruty's spring schedule. These issues need attention: 1) Furnace – the Fellowship Hall furnace is not working properly. N&S has been contacted. 2) Toilets in the Fellowship Hall are plugging regularly. Jason will contact 4M. 3) Jenny noted that the fans and lights in the sanctuary could use a good cleaning. The Council Committee: Jo, the property manager, is working with the tenant on a payment plan that is having positive results. Mission: In October, 10 households representing 37 individuals were served. Ingathering kits were prepared for November 5: 6 baby layette kits, 18 personal dignity kits, and 18 school kits – a total of 42 kits. Old Business: Three-part renovation proposal was approved by congregation vote on Sunday, October 23. Charge Conference reports/forms and budget were approved by congregation vote Sunday, October 23. New Business: Apportionments: It was agreed to table apportionments until the December meeting. Our future with the lowa Conference of the United Methodist Church: December 23 is the deadline for making a decision.
