<u>Blood Drive – Feb. 6, 2-6:30 PM</u>





Jason shared special events with his reports: October: UCC Memorial service for Kathy Ann Weldon Oct. 10; UCC Memorial service for Dolores Siegle Oct. 22. ACC Wedding for Rachel and David Garrison. Christian Education: The Youth Christmas Program was held during worship on December 18. Kids' Club will resume for Spring session on Wednesday, January 18. It has been understood that UCC provides Jason with a desktop computer and ACC provides him with a portable unit. 2 – Replace projector screen at the front of sanctuary to avoid covering the cross on the altar. 3 – Toilets – when purchase ADA toilet for sanctuary, buy 3 because the two toilets currently in the Fellowship Hall are prone to plugging. 4 – Part of the renovation includes creating a coffee/snack area with running water to eliminate carrying coffee pots up and down stairs. Within that area there would be space for an under-counter refrigerator for bottled water. Request: Money for under counter refrigerator. Parsonage Committee: Jo is doing a great job getting our renter back on track with rent payments. Colleen was granted permission to reach out to Jo and pay her for work completed to date. Mission: - In December, the Mission Committee served 7 families representing 25 individuals. For Christmas they had 10 children. They received almost \$500 from FOCO in 2022. The Mission Committee will be sure to extend thanks to the FOCO for placing a donation canister at their business. Bridges still has money in the Mission Account. Memorial Committee: Monies from the Sandy Stout Family to be used for the bathroom and parking lot renovation have been received. Old Business: Pastor Jason has arranged for one of two

meetings about Methodist affiliation to be held. The first will be on Sunday, February 5 at UCC. There will be a potluck at 4:30 PM followed by the informational meeting at 5 PM. **New Business**: 1 – Approved the purchase of a replacement iPad for Jason. 2 – New screen and frame at front of sanctuary. Test run was not acceptable. This issue is on hold. 3 – Jason will discuss further with Wilson's and 4M before taking further action on toilets. 4 – Approved up to \$250 for undercounter refrigerator. 5 – Celebrations in 2023 – We have 4 major events this year: 1 - Jason celebrates 10 years with us on April 1; 2 – The South Church turns 110 years old; 3 – The North Church turns 100 years old; 4 – Completion of renovation project. The Council agreed to have the Worship Committee plan up to 4 potlucks for 2023 to celebrate these occasions. Completion of the renovation project will be a separate event.
